HCTA seeks the immediate intervention of His Excellency in this vital issue that will mould and govern the vision of higher education in the state.

2. Complete withdrawal of the semester system: Sir, the present semester system that was introduced by the previous government, has a number of inherent demerits and shortcomings in it. Implemented myopically and in a hurried manner, it has failed to deliver the goods. The lop sided teacher-student ratio, lack of staff council and departmental council in the colleges, the perpetual decline in co-curricular and NCC/NSS related activities, a burdened examination system, dwindling class room teaching, the ever pending results etc are some of the many pitfalls of the present semester system. The government is earnestly implored through his Excellency, to curtail the present semester system immediately for safeguarding the future of the students and to prevent gradual erosion of higher education in the state of Haryana.

3. Service Security Act for Self-Finance Teachers: Sir, the exploitation and step-motherly treatment given to the teachers working under Self Finance scheme in the colleges and universities of Haryana is a matter of great concern to all of us. The HCTA vehemently endorse the view that a **Service Security Act** should immediately be framed and implemented by the government to safe guard the salary and service conditions and to prevent the deterioration of academic ambiance in the sphere of higher education in Haryana.

The HCTA once again congratulate you and hope that through our collected and concerted efforts, along with the vision that His Excellency have for reshaping the future of Haryana, the sphere of higher education will reach new glorious heights in the state of Haryana.
